

From the Vacancy Minister



Dear St. Matthew's community,

I just returned from a long week in Germany. I visited Dresden in Saxony where I officiated at a family wedding and then spent some time with family and friends in the Hanover region where I was born and

raised. I enjoyed my travels. I had never been to Dresden before and was impressed with the *Altstadt* (old town). The city center was completely in ruins after WW II and had been slowly rebuilt. The famous *Frauenkirche* (Church of Our Lady) was completed in 2005 and is one of the few Lutheran baroque churches in Germany. I attended an Evening Prayer and enjoyed the company of tourists from all over the world. We spoke different languages and came from different Christian traditions, yet we found unity in the singing of hymns and reciting the Lord's Prayer. It was a

wonderful experience to hear the difference voices and accents...and for a moment, while we were gathered in the crypt praying and singing, I felt a deep connection with these fellow strangers.

The Frauenkirche was first built in the 11th century in a Romanesque style. The church was Catholic until the Reformation, when it became Lutheran. I stood in awe thinking of the many people who had gathered and worshiped in this place before me. I realize that no matter where we find ourselves in the world, we can find connection and community through the church. We just hosted a Tarik, a young high school graduate from Nierenhof, Germany (Westphalia) at St. Matthew's who was traveling the world before beginning his university studies. We didn't know each other before, but we stay connected through our faith in Christ. Perhaps this is one of the greatest gifts of the church faith: community. We don't always have to agree on every aspect of church doctrine or denominational policy, but through faith, we stay connected in Christ.

Especially when we face hardships or have to deal with a difficult situation, we can find support, care, and mutual encouragement from our siblings in faith. When was the last time you stepped foot in a church? What first strikes for you when you enter a sanctuary...the pews...the stained-glass windows...the smell...the altar...the cross...a piece of art...the organ...?

The Psalmists knew what they were talking about when they mentioned God's beautiful dwelling places (Ps. 84). I was reminded how beautiful St. Matthew's sanctuary is and how stellar our acoustics are when I recently attended the Golden Gate Men's Chorus' summer concert.

So much is happening this fall—come and see the beauty of our God's church and see the face of Christ in your fellow siblings.



God is present in every part of creation, but God can be especially found in the church...in the proclamation of the Word and the celebration of the

Sacraments. At St. Matthew's we have recently received new members by baptism and by affirmation of baptism; we celebrate Holy Communion on every 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month and every holiday; and fellowship activities and a fall bible study are beginning in September. The church is not a building but the living and loving community where all are welcome, and where God's grace and love are shared with all who seek it. Looking forward to seeing you in and around our St. Matthew's soon!



Bibelkurs im Herbst: "Die alttestamentlichen Bücher der Weisheit" (auf Englisch)






